

## The King's Great Matter: Henry & Catherine

Arranged Marriage
Arthur & Catherine of Aragon (1501)
Stronger alliance with Spain
Defense against Scotland & France

Untimely Death
Arthur dies months after marriage (1502)
Remarriage to new heir: Henry VIII?

Betrothal & Papal Dispensation
Henry & Catherine betrothed (1503)
Papal Dispensation
Grounds: Affinity
'Stronger' than needed: Consummation?

Marriage
Henry's Misgivings: Doubts & Leviticus



#### The King's Great Matter: The Marriage (1509-1533)

Children

Girl, stillborn (1510)

Henry, died at seven weeks (1511)

Miscarriage (1514)

Mary Tudor (1516)

Girl, stillborn (1518)

Tension; Eased slightly by Mary

Henry's Mistresses

Total number disputed; Two undisputed

Elizabeth Blount (1516-19)

Henry FitzRoy

Duke of Richmond



# The King's Great Matter: Henry's Desire for a Male Heir

Previous Wars of Succession Need for Undisputed Male Heir 'Failure' of Marriage

Possible Solutions

Legitimize Henry FitzRoy?
Requires Papal Dispensation
Alienation of Spain?

Marry Mary to Henry FitzRoy?

Marriage of Half-Siblings?

Another Problem, Worse Than the First

Annulment of Marriage to Catherine Requires Papal Appeal and Approval Frees Henry to Remarry, Produce Male Heir



#### The King's Great Matter: Seeking the Annulment (1527-33)

Type of Request Not Uncommon

Extra-Canonical Complications
Pope Clement VII: Displease Charles V?
Emperor Charles V: Catherine's Nephew

Pope's Suggestion: Secret Second Wife Legitimacy of Male Heir at Stake Not an Appealing Solution

Clement Prolongs the Deliberations
Conditional Dispensation for New Marriage
Referral to Wolsey
Must be Decided in Rome, Not England
Wolsey Bears the Blame
